- All members, except dual members, receive four issues of their primary publication: The *Journal of American History*, published in June, September, December, and March; or The *OAH Magazine of History*, published in January, April, July, and October.
- Members also receive *OAH Outlook: A Membership Newsletter of the OAH*, published in August, November, February, and May.
- The *OAH Annual Meeting Program* is mailed to all members of the Organization, including dual members, in January of each year.
- Membership also includes online searchable access to all OAH publications through the OAH Web site, Recent Scholarship Online, and book discounts through Oxford University Press.
