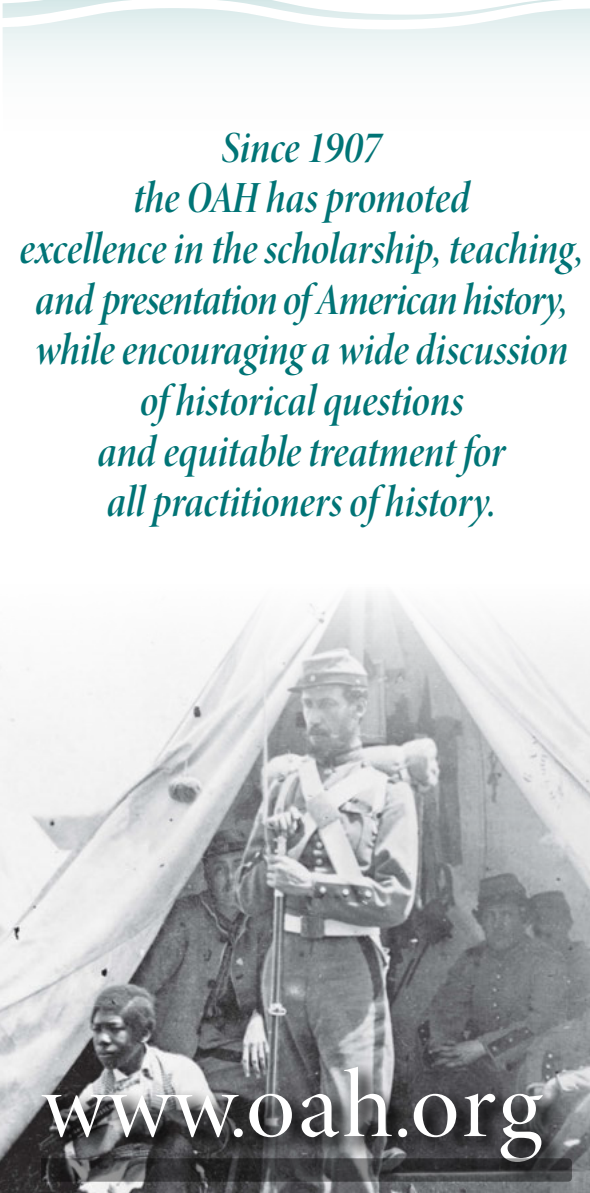

Journal of American History—the *JAH* is the leading scholarly publication in the field of U.S. history.
